This one-day workshop will feature sessions that will help the park and recreation professional recognize when a citizen or coworker may be in a crisis and help equip you with the information needed to point them in the right direction for help. Presentations will feature information about crisis theories, as well as how to engage local resources after a crisis has occurred.

- 2. Participants will be able to list the steps of crisis intervention .
- 3. Participants will be able identify risks factors for suicide and crisis and suicide intervention resources in their community.

Alexandra (Ali) Martinez received her Master's and Specialist's degree in Marriage and Family Therapy from University of Florida in 2001. She then worked for several non-profit organizations providing counseling services to families struggling with issues of domestic violence, child abuse and substance use. In 2005, Ali became the Training Coordinator for the Alachua County Crisis Center where she ran the training program for crisis line counselors, provided consultation and training on crisis and suicide intervention and served as a supervisor and site coordinator for the Crisis Center's internship and Family Clinic

programs. From 2012-2014, Ali worked at the University of Florida's Counseling and Wellness as a student counseling specialist before returning to the Alachua County Crisis Center in October of 2014, accepting the position of Director. Over the past 13 years, she has offered over 2000 hours worth of workshops, trainings and consultations on crisis and suicide intervention, culture and diversity issues and couples and family therapy.
