
Got Youth Leadership

Leadership Today is a youth leadership development program available to 9th Grade students residing in the Westerville City School District. Founded in 2002, Leadership Today seeks to identify existing and emerging teen leaders who desire to develop their leadership potential for school and civic responsibility.

Future Leaders 11th Grade Leadership Development Program

The Leadership Westerville "Future Leaders" Program has been designed to provide opportunities for 11th Graders to learn and practice leadership, citizenship and life skills that empower them to become productive members of society and exemplary leaders.

- Goals:
- ▶ 1. Provide leadership opportunities for teens
- ▶ 2. Provide opportunities to interact with diverse groups of people
- ▶ 3. Enhance life skills
- ▶ 4. Develop workforce preparation skills
- ▶ 5. Explore post-secondary options
- ▶ 6. Increase the sense of community responsibility in teen participants

Application Process

- ► Information to consider and questions to ask:
- Activities, Honors and Volunteer Leadership Involvement
- What do you consider to be your most important accomplishment in your school or community?
- If I could change one thing in my community, I would:
- What specific skills and or knowledge do you hope to gain from your participation
- References, both academic and community
- Parent and participant email address

Outcomes

- Greater confidence in speaking at meetings or assemblies and taking on peer leadership roles
- Greater confidence in resolving conflict without the assistance of adults
- Increased empathy during community service projects
- Higher average GPA's than non-leadership participants
- Increased involvement in school decision making processes
- Increased interest in attending postsecondary school
- Positive participation and contribution to class discussions


