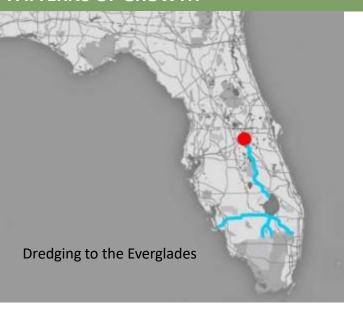

Benefits to Date

- Estimated 500,000 visitors annually
- Monthly Festivals: Movie in the park attract 2,000 10,000 per event
- Improved lake habitat and water quality, storm water treatment
- Increased downtown activity Cooperative Ventures w/ Kissimmee Main Street:
 Farmers Market, Food Truck Rodeo
- \$65 million new planned development
- \$17 million investment from the Kissimmee Utility Authority (KUA)
- Increase in property values throughout downtown
- New direct and indirect employment: two food concessions operating within park
- Fee-based venues booked 3month-1year in advance: pavilions, wedding lawn, events space, community house
- The addition of a public parking garage with 381 free spaces at the cost of \$9 million.
- New Sun Rail Station 3rd largest ridership of 16 stations
- Parking garage with 400 spaces.
- The Mosaic project, 10 acres over 2 parcels. With 288 apartments currently under construction, 15ksf of commercial & future townhomes
- Mosaic development will eventually generate 1,500 to 1,600 new full-time residents in downtown.

DELIVERING THE WISHES OF THE PUBLIC

Public Comments:

- Retain green space and natural beauty
- Connect downtown and the Lakefront
- Make park more secure: deter panhandlers and homeless
- Preserve the view of Lake Toho
- o Improve park use: both daily and during special events
- Non-park development, such as residential and commercial should occur in the City owned land adjacent to Lakefront Park

Goals:

- Create a vibrant waterfront that reconnects with downtown
- Revitalize open space and recreational elements
- o Redevelop adjacent land to attract new development to lake side

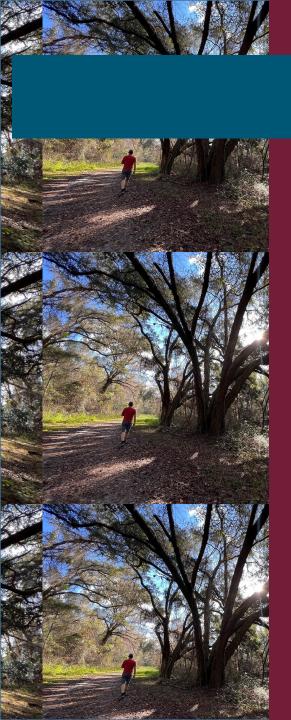

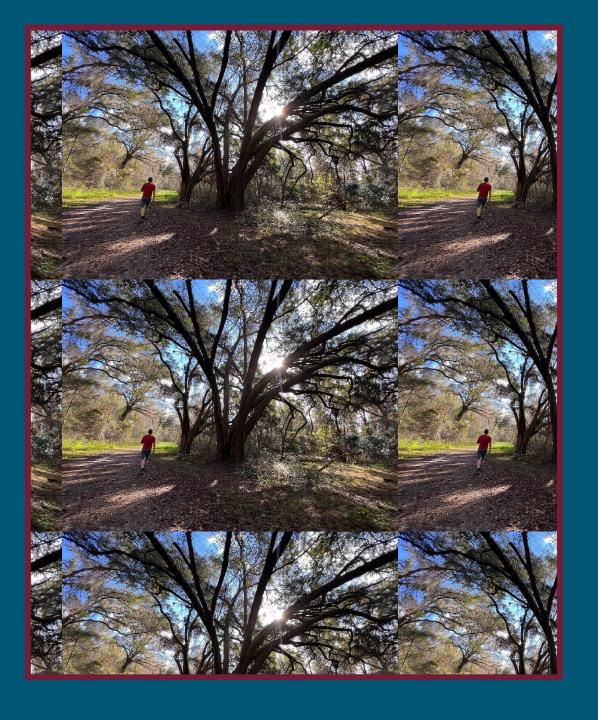
