Step 1:

- Drill holes in the container for drainage
- Place plant fabric on bottom of container
- Add soil





Step 2:

- Start Planting
 - Tomato
 - Pepper
 - Cilantro
 - Chives





How to Read the Back of a Seed Packet

Days to	Depth	Seed	Row	Days to
Germinate	to Sow	Spacing	Spacing	Harvest
7-12	1/8 in	1 in	12-18 in	45

Days to Germinate = How many days until the seed begins to grow

Depth to Sow = How deep to plant seed

Seed Spacing = How far apart to plant seeds

Row Spacing = How far apart to put the rows of plants

Days to Harvest = How many days until the item is ready to harvest

Other Useful Information:

When to Plant Outdoors



Comins Hints: Start a new crop every 2 to 21 days for a continuous barrent. Harvest young leaves to be 4 to 6 inches fall by catting an such above the soil line.





- salt and pepper


